DEFINITION OF PLAGIARISM

PLAGIARISM

- copying another's work or borrowing someone else's original ideas

PLAGIARIZE

- steal and pass off (the ideas or words of another) as one's own
- use (another's production) without crediting the source
- commit literary theft
- present as new and original an idea or product derived from an existing source

PLAGIARISM

All of the following are considered plagiarism:

- i. turning in someone else's work as your own
- ii. copying words or ideas from someone else without giving credit.
- iii. failing to put a quotation in quotation marks
- iv. giving incorrect information about the source of a quotation.
- v. changing words but copying the sentence structure of a source without giving credit.
- vi. copying so many words or ideas from a source that it makes up the majority of your work, whether you give credit or not (see our section on "fair use" rules)

Citing sources

- Simply acknowledging that certain material has been borrowed




Citation

- Is the way you tell your readers that certain material in your work came from another source. It also gives your readers the information necessary to find that source again, including:
 - information about the author
 - the title of the work
 - the name and location of the company that published your copy of the source
 - the date your copy was published
 - the page numbers of the material you are borrowing


